About the Schools

King's provides continuous day and boarding education for girls and boys aged two to 18 years. It comprises King's College Prep which has approximately 300 children from 2 to 13 and a senior school with approximately 450 pupils from 13 to 18.

The schools are situated on separate sites in the south west of England and combine traditional values with state-ofthe-art facilities. Both schools are run by one governing body, with many functions (marketing, strategy and finance for example) undertaken jointly.

Music at King's College

Our Music Department is staffed by the Director of Music, the Head of Academic Music, the College Organist and at least 16 visiting instrumental teachers. Tuition is offered on a full range of instruments, across a broad range of styles. Pupils take approximately 120 instrumental and singing lessons each week, and we hope to see these numbers growing further under inspirational leadership. Pupils' abilities range from beginner to diploma level, although most Music Scholars enter King's College with at least Grade 5 at year 9, or a Grade 8 in year 12.

Current major ensembles include:

- The Chapel Choir 50 pupils, which provides the music for our weekly service as well as a number of other special services;
- The Symphony Orchestra ca. 25 pupils, which plays a range of film and classical music;
- The Big Band, which comprises a complete professional line-up and performs an exciting repertoire of swing, jazz and pop standards.

Smaller ensembles include the Chamber Choir, which is drawn from the more-experienced Chapel Choir members, rock bands, vocal ensembles, a string ensemble and many other ad hoc groups.

Each ensemble has performing opportunities in large and small concerts, not only in the many venues the school has to offer, but also to a wider public in churches, prep schools and concert halls. Recent tours have taken in Venice, Barcelona and Barbados. The College venues include our Chapel - with its splendid acoustic - a fully equipped theatre, the Woodard Room, the Octagon and the splendid Amphitheatre. Concerts are many and varied, and we welcome parents, staff and pupils to everything that our musicians do.

Several of our pupils play in ensembles outside school. King's College musicians are, or have been, members of the Somerset Youth Orchestra, National Children's Orchestra, National Youth Orchestra and the National Youth Choir of Great Britain. The Chapel Choir has also sung at major national concerts organised by the Woodard Corporation at the Royal Albert Hall, the Symphony Hall in Birmingham, and Westminster Abbey.

Soloists are encouraged to perform in the regular, informal, Octagon concerts, which provide a more intimate and supportive environment. Pupils sign up for these opportunities, and beginners and more advanced players feature on the same programme.

The Music School offers spaces for teaching which include the Octagon, the Computer Room and instrumental and singing teaching rooms. It also has several offices and a Recording Studio, with separate Control Room. The department is well equipped with Apple iMac computers (running Sibelius and Logic ProX), excellent pianos, a good selection of percussion instruments, a music library and some departmental loan instruments (although most pupils have their own). The Octagon, Woodard Room and Chapel all have recently purchased Yamaha Grand pianos. The Chapel has a Yamaha C7, but the icing on the cake is our organ, a fine two-manual tracker instrument with electronic combination pistons, built by JW Walker in 1980, using part of the case and pipework of a London instrument said to date from around 1760.

Music at King's College

Academic Music

Music is taken by all Third Form (year 9) classes. Like all of our non-examination courses, music provision is exciting and diverse, covering topics such as aspects of Western Classical Music, Music and the Media, and Popular Song. Through a challenging programme of listening and practical work, the pupils discover how music is created and presented.

GCSE Music follows the Eduqas specification, and numbers taking the course have been good for many years.

A level Music has recently moved to Eduqas, focusing on a range of musical genres, whilst A level Music Technology (Edexcel) caters for musicians who would like to study studio music, and we have had great success in both subjects recently.

Scholarships

Music scholarships are offered at 11+, 13+ and at 16+. Typically, a full scholarship offers a remission on fees, along with free tuition on two instruments or voice. Exhibitions are also awarded; these offer tuition on one instrument. All award holders are expected to play a full and active role in the musical life of the school, and awards are reviewed annually.

King's College has a lively and friendly Common Room of over 50 full-time teachers, all of whom contribute to the school's outstanding cocurricular programme of sport, music and many other activities. The ability to contribute to this programme would be a distinct advantage. All teachers also tutor a small number of pupils and undertake an evening duty in one of our boarding houses, the Sixth Form Centre or the library.

The School

King's College is an exciting, forward-looking and rewarding school to work in. We support all staff to develop their teaching and pastoral skills, providing frequent access to high quality professional development, utilising the skills and experience of colleagues through our peer-coaching programme and tailoring professional development to each individual and their aspirations. We believe that investing in the development our staff is a key element in ensuring excellent teaching, learning and pastoral care.

We are keen to embrace new ideas and technologies to ensure that teachers at King's are at the forefront of teaching and learning innovation, and are rightly proud of the quality of pedagogy displayed daily around the school. Two members of the SMT are directly responsible for the wellbeing (Assistant Head Common Room) and professional development (Assistant Head Teaching and Learning) of all staff at King's. New heads of department will have a professional mentor, chosen from the current middle managers to guide and develop them in the first year; the new head of department will also have fortnightly catch-up meetings with the Deputy Head Academic to help them in their new role.

The Role

Job function

The Director of Music is responsible for all aspects of music making at King's College. The Director of Music will work closely with the Head of Academic Music, who is head of department for music as an academic subject.

The Director of Music will be expected to work closely with the Headmaster, the Assistant Head Co-Curricular, the Chaplain, the College Organist, the Director of Music at King's College Prep, the Deputy Head Pastoral, the Head of Performing Arts, the Director of Admissions and the Director of Marketing.

Key responsibilities

- Provide dynamic, inspirational and clear leadership of the Music
 Department.
- Ensure that music continues to develop as a high-profile activity

 at King's College.
- Establish King's College as one of the top senior school choices for ambitious, musically talented pupils in the South West and beyond.
- Work closely with the Director of Music at King's College Prep to ensure the continuity of aims and values between the prep and
 senior schools, and to establish a regular programme of joint musical activities between the two schools.
- Produce and maintain a detailed development plan for music at the College.
- Manage the music budget in conjunction with the Head of Academic Music, and create an annual submission reflective of the needs of the department.
- Be responsible for the recruitment, management, support and appraisal of visiting music teachers.
- Work to grow the numbers of pupils taking individual music lessons.
- Through regular and effective monitoring, ensure that individual and group music teaching is of the highest standard, and that high-quality ensemble opportunities are available to all College musicians.
- Lead, manage and develop a range of ensembles. Ensure that each ensemble has a dedicated staff member to lead them and ensure that they are fully prepared for concerts.
- In conjunction with the Director of Admissions and the Director of Marketing, be responsible for the musical outreach programme, creating links with prep schools and primary schools in the local area and wider afield, and following through opportunities to use music in marketing the school to the wider community.

Be a key member of the academic music department, teaching a timetable of lessons as appropriate.

Teach instrumental lessons as appropriate.

Run the music scholars programme, including organising the scholarship process at 13+ and 16+, overseeing the progress scholars are making, annually reviewing that progress and reporting to parents, and providing opportunities for music scholars to showcase their talents.

Lead, organise and manage a rich and varied programme of music concerts and performances, to ensure that as many pupils as possible are given the chance to perform in public.

Keep oversight of the facilities in the Music School and, in conjunction with the Operations Manager, ensure that the facilities, both musical and structural, are maintained, refurbished and replaced as necessary to ensure the continued success of the department.

Plan and manage a regular programme of outings and tours for school ensembles.

• Encourage pupils to participate in local, regional and national activities and competitions, supporting musicians in their preparation for these, as appropriate.

Provide musical support for dramatic productions, including school musical, working closely with the Head of Performing Arts.

Have oversight, either directly or through an appointed specialist, of the selection and performance of appropriate music to produce inspirational services, both for the regular pattern of weekly worship and for special occasions.

Either by rehearsing or conducting in person, or through and appointed specialist, ensure that the Chapel Choir continues to thrive and perform at the highest level, and that the high standard of congregational singing at the College is sustained.
